Comments	<p>I would request that the Planning Authority consider the following extract from the Recycle Southern website: 'It is recognised by much of the public, local businesses, and authorised bodies that our Recycling facility is regarded as a necessary commodity including WSCC themselves, being that the majority of the soil and hardcore from household amenity sites (your 'local tip') throughout the county is brought here for recycling.'</p> <p>I would suggest that it is NOT generally known that THE MAJORITY OF HARDCORE FROM HOUSEHOLD AMENITY SITES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY is brought to this site. If this is indeed the case, it is reprehensible that permission was granted in the first place for the siting of this business with the constant movement of heavy vehicles on what has become a very busy stretch of the A259 between Bognor Regis and Chichester. The WSCC Highways Authority which has responded with 'no objection' might care to consult the plans for imminent housing development in this area with its attendant lack of infrastructure regarding traffic.</p> <p>Furthermore, this claim by Recycle Southern raises questions around impartiality regarding the decision to be made with reference to this current retrospective application. It would be unfortunate if there occurred any perception of bias in favour of a business which already has contractual arrangements with the WSCC, and would undoubtedly result in reputational damage to the fairness of process.</p> <p>The wide ranging objections to this planning application indicate that any expansion of activity by Recycle Southern at the Elbridge Farm site will lead to detrimental consequences not only for immediate businesses and residents affected, but also for a much wider population who use the A259 at this point as a means of going about their daily lives.</p>
