To whom it may concern,

I am writing to you regarding the proposed planning application for the refilling of the Rock Common Quarry. We have lived in the village for fifteen

years, having moved from Worthing.

The application states the waste would be of an wet description, what that is exactly known seems to know. Also it would be monitored by themselves.

As is common knowledge there is an aquifer that runs underneath the quarry, hence the need for the continual need for pumping into the Honey bridge Stream.

How this application can ever been taken seriously by any council really boggles belief. It would be an absolute disaster for Washington and the surrounding area.

Their application also mentions a processing / recycling plant. That alone would mean something in the region of 500 Lorries movements per day, on roads that are already choked up, and the A 283 into Stowring ton has the dubious distinction of the most polluted road in England.

At the moment the Quarry is a perfect home for nature, including Peregrine Falcons, Sand Martins, and Crested Mews. That would be a total disaster for the above mentioned wild life.

Being so close to cheltenhambury ring and in the south downs national park, was for us, only moving of our neighbours the reason we settled here.
