The stream provides water to our two lakes , various ponds and a marsh .
Both the lakes and the marsh are only ten to twenty yards from the stream and in one place it is only six .They are full or water birds, fish ,marsh frogs , great-crested newts , etc etc .The reserve has many small mammals and is a wonderful wild flower habitat .
Sand martins are in steep decline and every habitat is vital .It is unthinkable to lose them or the Peregrinnes from the pit .
The evidence in the stream shows it is impossible to prevent pollution, which will kill all the wonderful wildlife on our property .
We would also like to support the village in their objections to noise and most of all the traffic
