Comments	<p>Dear sir</p> <p>I wish to very strongly object to yet another application (WSCC/028/21) from Winston Estates & Dudmans for a Landfill and Processing / Recycling Plant at ROCK COMMON QUARRY. It has been turned down before and is NOT part of the Parish Plan, which has been several years in planning and making, with considerable participation of all the local residents over those years.</p> <p>1. Washington and Storrington are already very heavily congested with heavy lorry / HGV Traffic on the A283 and is one of the most polluted roads in the UK, with exceedingly high traffic fumes poisoning the local population, many of which are old people and young children, as Storrington and Washington are mostly populated with retirees, particularly during day and during working hours. It is obvious that there would be a massive increase in heavy HGV Tipper Truck movement, which we already have a high volume of with the operational Cemex Sand Quarry's on the A283, at Sandgate Park. I'd also like to point out the noise, fumes and dust generated from the HGV's driving along the narrow road known as The Hollow and the mud that would be inevitably be left on the nearby roads like the A24 (Fast moving traffic at 70MPH) and the A283.</p> <p>2. As can be seen in the quarry, the previous Landfill is now failing and waste that has been dumped from years ago is now poisoning the woodland and wildlife and leeching into the underground streams and aquifers which supply the local steams and in particular the Honeybridge Stream. This area dose not need any more waste dumped in it and particularly as is within the SOUTH DOWNS NATIONAL PARK, this is not acceptable. This is damaging of our water courses and in particular our speacial and precious Chalk Streams that are renowned worldwide. The UK Chalk Streams account for 70% of the worlds Chalk Streams and this application is unacceptable.</p> <p>Jon Baker</p>
