I've taken a quick look at the need for it. In 2014 West Sussex County Council adopted its Waste Plan. It put in place policies and strategies to lead to a zero waste to landfill situation by 2031. Fascinating to read West Sussex is a net importer of waste. It says that in order for the Plan to add up 'it is assumed that additional facilities providing for a total of 0.16mega tonnes/annum are needed and it is assumed an 'energy from waste' treatment facility will be required although using weasel words it says authorities are NOT planning for this. Earlier this year the planning inspectorate permitted an incinerator facility in Horsham which will handle up to 350,000 tonnes of waste per year. Last year the Waste Plan was reviewed. It concluded that 'overall waste arisings are likely to be 200,000 tonnes higher than originally forecast - most of it construction, demolition and excavation waste, of which 75% can be recycled for beneficial use. Further it concludes that 'current planned capacity is 0.75 mega tonnes higher than arising expected in 2031 under higher growth scenarios'. I would therefore suggest the proposed facility is not needed, risks creating a market to burn waste instead of recycling it, and would mean West Sussex importing even more waste.
