Comment Comments	Dear Sir/Madam, Please see my comments and objections to the application WSCC/036/20. This is ill- considered, environmentally polluting and a visually horrendous proposal. The reasons for my objection are as follows: 1. The viability of the site should be determined by the availability of sufficient quantities of high calorific value waste, thus limiting the number of truck movements. This must be sustainable for the lifetime of the facility. If predominantly low calorific-value waste is used, this will require both more trucks and for those trucks to be coming from further afield, beyond the boundaries of West Sussex. This facility is supposed to be part of a WSCC waste management strategy. 2. It is not reasonable, or acceptable, to increase truck movements to offset the unavailability of high calorific value fuel to be burned, as this results in increments of both greenhouse gases and pollutants for Nor staged deliveries (i.e. dropping waste from outside Sussex inside the county boundary) and then delivering it to site. This will generate huge quantities of unnecessary CO2 emissions and pollutants. 3. Increasing truck movements will have several times referred to highways the por state of Church Lane. You can see from my address the location of my house and over the years we have witnessed many accidents at the Horsemere Green Lane/Church Lane road junction, the massively increased amount of traffic movements will further add to the potential for such accidents and god forbid, one day, one of these will be a fatality! 4. CO2 emissions are a global issue, leading to global warming, and the CO2 from all of these should be imposed if the site is found to be not wholly carbon neutral. 6. There should be a plan for the total CO2 output from the site to be offset by vegetation and tra-planting 7. Pollutants will impact the health of local residents. Have any studies been done near other such facilities to determine the impact? This is particularly important bearing in mind the 1000s of new residents that potential
