| Neronica Castle <br> Type of <br> Comment <br> Comments | Objection  <br>  WSCC/036/20: Ford Energy Recovery Facility. I am raising an objection to the above planning <br> application. The view from the South Downs National Park will be considerably impacted by the <br> proposed facility. Ford Parish Council's neighbourhood Plan represents a Ford Airfield development of <br> 1500 houses which will be adjacent to the proposed site. An incinerator adjacent will compromise the <br> quality of this key local development. Proper photographic evidence of views has not been included in <br> the application, and weak excuses have been given for this. An 85m chimney stack will have a <br> significant visual impact on neighbourhood properties. It will be visible from Walberton (where I live). <br> A structure of this nature and use will impact air quality severely not only for the inhabitants of the <br> proposed 1500 houses on the Ford airfield site, but for many miles around, including Wallerton parish. <br> This will impact on both human health, leading in some cases to death, diminishing quality of life and <br> having a disastrous effect on the natural world. This at a time when there is so much concern about <br> the effects of global warming and pollution on the natural world and human well being. It is anticipated <br> that there will be 240 HGV movements per day. Immediate local roads are minor and the A259 to the <br> south is already busy. Three of the possible offline A27 Arundel bypass routes cross the top of <br> Walberton Parish enabling easy access to the A27. It is likely that the HGV increase on Yapton Lane will <br> be considerable. There will be added conflict with the extra traffic from the new housing estate - 1500 <br> houses could give 3000 extra cars to conflict with these HGV movements. There have been a number <br> of fires at Household Waste Recycling Centres and these fires can be difficult to extinguish. A fire <br> immediately next to the new Ford Airfield housing estate will result in major issues with hazardous <br> fumes. I strenuously oppose this proposal. |
