We have already responded to this application (Ref HA/2020/122658/01) however we have since been made aware of some further information with regards to the land raising on site. A substantial quantity of waste has been imported to land raise. This waste has been provided by an unauthorised and unlicensed facility (an illegal waste site). It cannot be presumed the material used for this is of an acceptable type and we have not been informed through the proper processes what type(s) of waste has been deposited and buried on site. This type of work would require an 'environmental deposit of waste permit' from the Environment Agency which has not been sought and has therefore not been regulated by us.

Although this is a permitting issue and not a planning issue, I am sending you this for your information and awareness. We encourage the applicant to contact us to discuss the permitting issue.
