Sorry for the delay.

I did fire off a response to you before going on leave but it seems we had some sort of email black hole and a lot of emails I sent never left our server.

I have looked at the analytical results and generally I am not concerned There are marginally elevated levels of polyaromatic compounds and some metals but no petroleum hydrocarbon contamination or additional asbestos was identified.

The localised presence of amosite at TP2 and elevated hydrocarbons and BAP in TP4 remain the only results of note. I would normally require the asbestos to be removed to limit future exposure but as it appears to be a discrete area within an end use with low sensitivity this is not strictly necessary.

I would agree with Debs comments that there are locally elevated levels of some contaminants but not at levels that make the site unsuitable for the use. I also share Debs reservations about the sufficiency of the sampling and it is likely that localised hotspots of contamination are present at the site. However I consider that enough information is available to show that the imported materials are not grossly contaminated or comprise significant quantities of hazardous wastes.
