## Highways England Planning Response (HEPR 16-01) Formal Recommendation to an Application for Planning Permission

Council's Reference: WSCC/052/20

Location: Land to the north of Eastergate and north-west of Barnham, PO22 0DF

Proposal: The construction of a 1.3km single carriageway with a 3m wide shared cycleway/footway, 2.5m wide central island, one uncontrolled pedestrian crossing with a central island to enable users of the PRoW to cross the carriageway, three roundabouts, provision of hard and soft landscaping, road markings, traffic signals, bus stops, and signalised pedestrian crossings, construction of a substation building; installation of a noise barrier, and associated works.

Referring to the planning application referenced above received by Highways England on 14<sup>th</sup> January 2021, in the vicinity of the A27/A29 Fontwell Avenue Roundabout, West Sussex that forms part of the Strategic Road Network, notice is hereby given that Highways England's formal recommendation is that we:

- a) offer no objection
- b) recommend that conditions should be attached to any planning permission that may be granted (see Annex A Highways England recommended Planning Conditions);
- c) recommend that planning permission not be granted for a specified period (see Annex A further assessment required);

d) recommend that the application be refused (see Annex A – Reasons for recommending Refusal).

Highways Act Section 175B (covering new access to the SRN) is NOT relevant to this application.<sup>1</sup>

HIGHWAYS ENGLAND ("we") have been appointed by the Secretary of State for Transport as strategic highway company under the provisions of the Infrastructure Act 2015 and is the highway authority, traffic authority and street authority for the Strategic Road Network (SRN).
