Dear Sir,

I have read your letter (3/2/21) to Mr David Cassells WSP, it was a joy to read - for it is obvious from the letter and all the consultation documents that much of the proposed A29 realignment plan is flawed, and that many of the objections from local residents and Parish Councils have been taken on board.

As a 'very' local resident I strongly object to:

- 1) The proximity of the road to our properties.
- 2) The loss of the green space that gives the two villages of Eastergate and Bramham their identity.
- 3) loss of the wild life habitat.
- 4) The huge concern that flooding of our already precarious ground water levels and surface water levels will be compromised.
- 5) The hideous outlook we would have if the plans succeed i.e. the Noise Barriers, and the proposed screening with inadequate vegetation.

- 6) The loss of our personal privacy and safety as the land would seem to be open to all.
- 7) No mention of the existing Deed of Easement in respect of the ditch area along a portion of Chantry Mead - to which all homeowners are bound. How will this then be affected by the development?
- 8) The lack of information regarding noise, vibration, light and 'particle' levels: as they are now (we have not been allowed to know this information) and what they will be when the scheme is built and in use.

It is to be hoped that we will be able to have proper consultations, and that the road can be moved (if it has to be built) further west - away from our properties.
