Thank you for your notification of 14th January 2021 regarding the above application, seeking a response by 28th January 2021. For future reference please note that Highways England have a response period to consultations of 21 days and whilst we will endeavour to respond ahead of this target it may not always be possible due to heavy demands upon our time. In this instance we are responding ahead of our dead line but have not been able to respond in the time frame required by yourselves. Accordingly, we will expect the Council to consider any comments we may make on this application and seek your confirmation that this is the case in this instance.

Highways England has been appointed by the Secretary of State for Transport as strategic highway company under the provisions of the Infrastructure Act 2015 and is the highway authority, traffic authority and street authority for the strategic road network (SRN). The SRN is a critical national asset and as such Highways England works to ensure that it operates and is managed in the public interest,

both in respect of current activities and needs as well as in providing effective stewardship of its long-term operation and integrity. Highways England will be concerned with proposals that have the potential to impact on the safe and efficient operation of the Strategic Road Network (SRN), in this case the A27/A29 Fontwell Avenue junction.

The principle of the A29 Bypass (both phases) was previously considered by Highways England during the work undertaken to develop the Transport Strategy for the current adopted Arun Local Plan. As such we have no objection in principle with the council proceeding with Phase 1 of the Bypass proposals. In reviewing the WSP supporting TA we noticed that the accident analysis only considers 60 months of Stats 19 data to the end of 2017. As the TA is dated August 2020 we are surprised that the accident data has not included accidents recorded in 2018, 2019! The accident data for these years is fully validated and it is best practice to consider the latest 60 months of accident data. With an additional two years of data it is quite possible that the long term accident trend may have changed.

We also note that the outputs from the modelling work show different queue lengths and DoS at the A27/A29 Fontwell Avenue than those previously identified through the Arun Transport Assessment. We understand that this is because the current model used is more refined and current than that of the Arun modelling work. However, we have not been given the opportunity to review the wider strategic model and have been unable to undertake a detailed review of the supplied modelling in the timeframe given for response. We do note though that the results broadly reflect the traffic scenario's previously understood and in that respect we are not concerned at this point but reserve the right to review the modelling prior to Phase 2 of the Bypass coming forward. Accordingly, it should not be assumed that Highways England are in agreement with the modelling at this time. This however, does not prohibit Phase 1 of the Bypass proceeding as its individual impacts on the operation of the SRN are not considered severe.

Therefore, Highways England's position in relation to this particular application is that we do not have any objection to Phase 1 of the A29 Bypass proceeding as we are satisfied that the proposal will not materially affect the safety, reliability and / or operation of the SRN (the tests set out in DfT Circular 02/2013, particularly paragraphs 9 & 10, and MHCLG NPPF particularly paragraph 109), and our formal HEPR response form is attached accordingly.
