I have attached the scope of Air Quality assessment, please advise if this is required partially or in full.

Project also involves the demolition of the existing school. Brief description of this project is below;

The College is in Birchwood Grove Road, Burgess Hill, West Sussex, RH15 0DP.

1.3. Woodlands Meed is a Foundation Special School for pupils with a wide range of special needs who live

in Mid Sussex. The school is maintained by WSCC. Woodlands Meed operates on two shared school sites.

The school site educates pupils aged 2 to 14 and the College site pupils aged 14 to 19. The College site is

shared with Birchwood Grove Primary School. This project is for a new College on the College site. 1.4. Woodlands Meed College site has approximately 100 students, in 10 class groups. The project will see

an expansion in the size of the College by approximately 30 students plus a post 19 Unit for 6 students.

Students in KS4 (14-16 years old) and KS5 (16-19 years old) attend the College, where the aim is to prepare

them for moving on to adult life, whether this be to the workplace, to further education or to supportive adult

provision. The curriculum is personalised to the needs of the pupils as far as possible. Some classes

concentrate on developing independence in daily living activities, whilst others follow certificated courses

leading to GCSEs, Entry Level Certificates or NVQs.

1.5. WSCC's vision for the new Woodlands Meed College is to deliver an inspirational and flexible building.
