The Ford area simply cannot accommodate the amount of HGV traffic that this site would attract, not just waste from West Sussex but from all over the county. This coupled with the current 550 homes being built in Yapton and the proposed development of ATLEAST 1500 homes on the Ford airfield site is not sustainable. The Ford railway crossing already causes huge delays and queuing traffic at peak times causing an excess amount of pollution on its own. This would only be made worse by the constant queuing of HGVs and the incineration of plastic rather than recycling the material. The effect that the emissions would have on the area has to be considered here, the building would be exhausting fumes less than 300 metre from the boundary cottages and the Peregrines estate, this would be even less to the proposed homes at the Ford Airfield site. Priority of the welfare of the surrounding residence and wildlife must be upheld and allowing this to go ahead is in direct conflict to the amenities and well being of those in the ever-growing villages of Ford, Yapton and Climping. Arundel is a hugely popular tourist locations cited as one of the most picturesque places in Britain, allow the placement of two 85m stacks in clear site of this historic town and all along the West Sussex coastline would be an absolute abomination.
