I wish to object in the strongest possible terms to the proposal for an Incinerator on the Ford Airfield site for the following reasons. Firstly, this will be completely detrimental visually, to the local landscape. We are lucky enough to live on the edge of The South Downs National Park, which is a beautiful area. An Incinerator has absolutely NO place whatsoever in this area, especially when the proposed chimney stack is going to be higher than Chichester Cathedral!!. It will be a Carbuncle on the local landscape & must not be allowed to go ahead!. Secondly, the local roads are already choked with traffic, with frequent traffic jams & tailbacks. There are many new housing sites in the area, 4 in Yapton alone, which means that soon there will be even more traffic on local roads that are already struggling to cope. The thought of continuous HGV lorries bringing the waste from goodness knows where, to the Incinerator is just madness. The roads will NOT cope!.
