Seems ridiculous to pass planning permission for this eye-sore rubbish incinerator... I am a Design Engineer. I am doing my very best to be careful with the resources we have yet the government and councils flagrantly abuse their's. I could solve your waste problems and make the need for this eye-sore of an Incinerator not to be built. But there seems to be a suicidal mission to follow the road of insanity and go ahead with it.

Example

I could have saved you in the order of £8,000,000 when you went about the Chichester Flood Relief System, even then you wouldn't listen despite my proposal backed by two universities [attachment], and with civil engineering quotes at the time for £750,00, an extremely simple system without ongoing maintenance work now needed for the past 20 years.

Arun could be the leaders in this Country on rubbish reduction if they put their minds constructively to it. I even put my own house off grid with a Solar Panel system for less than £900. which also charges my electric bikes and runs the house for electric and anything else.

The main culprit for rubbish are the supermarkets and product and food manufactures. If they reduced, were forced to reduce the packaging we wouldn't have this problem, so the need for this insidious looking smell ridden monster which will be viewed not only from the South Downs National Park but from all around this area would no longer exist. I could help you, as I have tried to do before as above.

Fumes from this building will smell worse than what Lindsey Sewage works does, will go far and wide, except this will be full time when the wind in is the right direction where a new housing estate is situated as well.

Arun wants to allow this planning to be passed, the incinerator is full of toxic chemicals, is near schools and where people go to work and in a rural area. The health implications, the traffic - extra dustcarts....

Some of the main reasons for objecting

- **VISUAL IMPACT**

The visual impact of the 13 Storey high building (visible from as far away as Chichester) and TWO 28 Storey towers will affect: the South Downs National Park, Schedule Ancient Monuments, Grade 1 listed buildings and Sites of Special Scientific Interests.

- **NEW HOUSES OR INCINERATOR – THEY ARE NOT COMPATIBLE**

An incinerator of this size risks the deliverability of one of Arun District Council's key strategic sites for a new Settlement of a primary and secondary School with village centre and 1,500 houses. That was supported at a local referendum.

- **NO LOCAL NEED FOR MORE INCINERATORS & THEY HARM RECYCLING**

West Sussex already has enough Incineration sites with permission to meet its needs. Incineration is a barrier to the circular economy (recycling).

- **NOT GREEN ENERGY – HARMS AIR QUALITY**

Incineration is one of the worst ways of generating energy because of its effect on Climate Change. Emissions include dioxins, NOx and ultrafine particulate matter that can be harmful to both human health and the natural environment. There is not enough monitoring, not enough enforcement, and not enough transparency.

- **BIG LORRIES ON LOCAL ROADS**

The local roads cannot cope with the size and weight of the HGV movements being proposed.
