| Comments | <p>The proposed EfW facility's consented application shows the design of a chimney 85 metres in height, taller than the spire of Chichester Cathedral, with the tallest building proposed to have a height of 22 metres. This means that the proposed facility is nearly double the size of the site originally set out in the planning application approved in 2015. This represents an undesirable blight on the landscape local area in the shadow of the South Downs National Park.</p> <p>In addition I have concerns over air quality. Incineration is not the answer.</p> <p>A "high chimney" does not reduce pollution, it simply distributes the pollution into other areas. I do not see any consultation or pollution mapping done, showing which areas will be affected or on what scale. This is paramount.</p> <p>Not only is poor air quality and pollution affecting the lives of our young people as in the case of the death of Ella Kissi-Debrah, coroner Philip Barlow ruled that air pollution was a factor in Ella's death but we are in a climate crisis. By allowing this development to go ahead West Sussex County Council will be condoning the pollution and will be responsible for the fallout of pollution. It goes against the West Sussex County Council pledge and Carbon a management Plan.</p> <p>As a government body entrusted with keeping our towns and villages, clean and safe from pollution, West Sussex County Council is obligated to refuse this application.</p> |
