Comments

I have read the new submission from Loxwood Claypits carefully and find nothing in it to change my mind. It still seems that the extracted clay has no ready market and is not needed by any nearby user. Siting the waste recycling facility where it is proposed seems to be against all the local planning guidelines and will certainly cause increased traffic problems on the nearby, narrow country road. The wheel washing facility will still put extra pressure on an already stressed local water supply.

The main problem, however, is the position of the proposed building and pit. An area of woodland, some of which is ancient and all of which is beautiful and ecologically varied, is to have its character changed for at least a generation. Many lorries passing through the wood every day, producing noise, vibration and exhaust fumes will adversely affect both fauna and flora as well as distressing walkers along nearby footpaths.

Will there really be no light pollution near the building, not even a security light at night and if a generator is used to provide power will it not be a constant source of fumes?

The wheel washing facility will badly affect the tranquillity of a different part of the woodland where a footpath and a bridle way join together.

Approximately 1500 people have objected to this development which, if needed at all, should be built on a brown field site with better transport links. I ask the Planning Committee to please listen to the objectors and save a truly beautiful and peaceful part of our county and our lives.
