I uld like to object to this application based on the following: e applicant, Loxwood Clay Pits (LCP), makes clear in their company statement that if this polication is successful it will use it as precedent to try and develop other sites, "LCP is the first mpany to be established with an activity in the minerals sector with the intention to add other sinesses to that portfolio in due course." ere is no need for more capacity as can be seen from reading the Interim results for Ibstock Clay blished last week on 4 August 2021. Ibstock Clay is the leading manufacturer by volume of clay cks sold in the United Kingdom. With 16 manufacturing sites Ibstock Brick has the largest brick boduction capacity in the United Kingdom. It operates a network of 18 active quarries located close its manufacturing plants. They report, "Domestic industry production for the first five months of 21 totalled around 780 million bricks, being around 90% of 2019 levels, and imported brick umes reduced to around 17% of total market volumes supplied." And "The 60 million investment in e redevelopment of our clay brick facilities in the West Midlands will expand our capacity nificantly from early 2024, consolidating our leadership position in the clay brick market. It will also monstrate our commitment to leading our industry on sustainability issues, producing the UK's first -zero carbon bricks". , there is no need for new clay quarries in the Weald and any new capacity should be net-zero bon. This development will result in an increase in net carbon emissions. is is currently a safe, peaceful, rural site. Under this proposal HGV's will run alongside, and across iabilshed Public Rights of Way regularly used by members of the public giving rise to severe safety neerns. Furthermore this proposal does not compliment the natural environment or rural character the area and does not bring any demonstrable benefits to the loccal community which
