	I object to application WSCC/030/21 for the following reasons:-	
	I live in Cranleigh and like many other cyclists and walkers in the area have used the bridleway route via Rikkyo, through the Loxwood woodland for over 22 years. This route passes through wonderful woodland containing diverse habitats and is always full of excellent views, chances to spot nature in it's glory and is a peaceful area to ride and walk in. This all attracts visitors from outside the area who unwind, exercise, improve their mental health and also patronise pubs, cafes and the Loxwood Post Office.	
	The roads to and from this route, although narrow, are usually also reasonably quiet and therefore safe.
