My wife and I would like to object to the proposed Clay Pit and Waste Recycling Plant development at Loxwood.

The reasons for our objection are as follows.

The increase in heavy lorries on narrow country roads which are used daily for school busses and parents taking children to and from the local schools being totally unsuitable for such vehicles. This will cause damage to road surface and structure and also create a severe safety risk for all other road users.

There is sufficient clay in the area to last for 25years so further development is not necessary.

There is sufficient capacity for construction waste recycling in West Sussex in locations which are more suitable.


Loss, for ever, of important wild life habitat. These woodlands have always been a haven for Deer, Badgers and dozens of other animals – it would be unforgiveable to destroy what is an ancient woodland area.

We live next door to building site. Saxon Weald have demolished 6 perfectly serviceable bungalows and constructed two detached and two semi detached houses in a

small area totally unsuitable for such a development. For the last year we have been subjected to the movement of heavy lorries in in and out of the site. We therefore have a particular empathy for all those people in areas which will be subjected to a similar experience. The noise, pollution, dust and mud created is horrendous and cars, houses windows and road surfaces are covered in layers of filth. At least in our case the situation may improve once the houses are finished. The Loxwood situation will go on for years and years.

Please do not let this development take place.
