Comments	<p>I have had daily use of this un-spoilt woodland for over 30 years, walking dogs, jogging, cycling, climbing trees, building dams and dens with my children - all in this beautiful, rural wilderness.</p> <p>I find the proposed development utterly deplorable - if latest WSCC Mineral Monitoring Report says there is no demand for additional clay for bricks, then the development can only be viewed as being a waste site (by proxy). Paradoxically there is current no need for additional capacity for demolition/construction waste in West Sussex and given its rural location, this flies in that face of national policy for new waste sites being positioned on brownfield sites or build up areas.</p> <p>If you discount the clay pit, then building a huge industrial site, with halogen lighting, generators and wheel washes in pristine woodland can have no justification, it clearly is an unsuitable location.</p> <p>The proposed plan to recycle 50% of material is well below industry expectations, therefore "backfilling" the site would result in even more lorry movements than stated in the plan (as if 42 truck movements a day isn't enough). The route to the site is over 1km from the lay-by and allowing lorries to travel this will put leisure seekers at risk, result in the closure of footpaths and an increase in noise, net carbon emissions, pollution and dust.</p> <p>Once out of woods, access to Loxwood Road is precarious at best and the route to the A281 will pose an increased risk for all other road users. The road is not suitable for large vehicles passing at speed, there are tight corner, blind junctions, weak bridges and the road narrows in many places.</p> <p>The proposal is not needed, not sympathetic to the environment and will ruin a natural resource without any benefit to the local community.</p> <p>I would dearly love to enjoy these un-spoilt woodlands for another 30 years, with my grandchildren and would ask you to reject this utterly feckless proposal.</p>
