Comments	<p>Please see my Objections to the Planning Application WSCC/030/21 for Loxwood Clay Pits development of Pallinghurst Woods:</p> <p>Traffic - Loxwood Road is not able to take an increase in heavy vehicles. Anyone who regularly drives along the lane knows that large vehicles cannot stay on their own side of the road due to varying and narrow road width, the winding course of the road, and overhanging trees. Any mud left on the road by these heavy vehicles also represents another hazard for local road users. These concerns all represent a significant danger to local motorists, and other road users such as the many cyclists, horse riders, dog walkers and other pedestrians.</p> <p>The exhaust fumes emitted by these vehicles, and the dust from the site, will lower local air quality which has a direct impact on the health of the local community, especially those who are more vulnerable eg asthma sufferers.</p> <p>The junction with the A281 is also unable to handle a 300% increase in lorry traffic and this will cause problems along the A281.</p> <p>The development of this rural and quiet location is unnecessary and will cause extensive damage to the local environment and its wildlife. Destroying the trees and hedgerows which are vital for wildlife threatens the local species, and disturbance of the existing waterway could cause future flooding.</p> <p>The development of the site is completely unnecessary as there is more than enough clay capacity in West Sussex. The site will bring no wider benefits to the community and would wreck the tranquil location for over 30 years.</p>
