Comments	<p>Un Secretary general Mr Guterres said: "The alarm bells are deafening, and the evidence is irrefutable: greenhouse gas emissions from fossil fuel burning and deforestation are choking our planet and putting billions of people at immediate risk." The stark report from the Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) says that every tonne of CO2 matters and our actions now can still protect against further damage by refusing the Loxwood Clay Pits application. . That includes stopping any development in Pallinghurst woods as the development will result in an increase in net carbon emissions from the burning of fossil fuels and the removal of the tree canopy by felling and disturbance of the woodland floor, plus the carbon emissions from lorries.
