Comments	<p>I object to the proposed development for the following reasons:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. It will adversely affect fauna &amp; flora in the local vicinity of the CMRF &amp; clay extraction site.</li><li>2. It will close a PROW which has been walked by local people for decades.</li><li>3. The HGVs will pose a safety hazard to pedestrians/equestrian riders/dogs/cyclists walking the PROW/bridleway in the woods &amp; those walking/riding/cycling/driving in Loxwood Road,</li><li>4. It poses a safety hazard for vehicles passing the layby as this is the entrance/exit site for the HGVs &amp; the applicants' agents have said the traffic is travelling on average in excess of 50mph there.</li><li>5. There is not a need for the clay in West Sussex.</li><li>6 It is an unsuitable area for a CMRF.</li><li>7. There are many Listed buildings along the proposed lorry route &amp; on the alternate route through Loxwood, which could realistically be adversely affected by regular passing of HGVs.</li><li>8. Policy states that " the source should be as close as possible to the site where the clay is to be used or is well-related to the Lorry Route Network (LRN), so that local road use is minimised." This is not the case as the nearest Strategic Lorry Route, the A24 at Horsham, is 10 miles from the site, even the A281 (Local LRN) is 3 miles on a woodland track and a narrow C road.</li></ol> <p>There are many more reasons to object to this totally unsuitable application.</p>
