I have recently moved to Ifold from a more suburban place nearer to London, expecting to enjoy peace and tranquillity.

However, I have discovered that Loxwood

Clay Pits are planning to create a commercial waste recycling plant and associated clay pits close to Loxwood.

I have been informed that these plans will include 42 truck movements per day, passing along narrow local roads to the site and back.

This will be DETRIMENTAL TO THE AREA, and its residents causing noise and TRAFFIC PROBLEMS to what is at present a peaceful country area.

Apparently the HGVs will take waste from skips from demolition and construction sites, entering Pallinghurst woods at the

layby on the Loxwood road.

This whole waste recycling plant sounds a disaster for a beautiful and quiet area

and will NOT BENEFIT THE ENVIRONMENT OR lives of

any of THE RESIDENTS of Loxwood.

BACKGROUND NOISE will be disturbing all the residents and 6 HECTARES of WOODLAND will be DESTROYED to excavate clay.

Half the waste will be used to infill the clay pits.

For whose benefit is this noisy, trafficy unenvironmental idea being implemented?

It is totally AGAINST the PLEASANT LIVING CONDITIONS for all the residents of the surrounding area and THEREFORE it SHOULD NOT BE ALLOWED.
