| Comments | <p>I would like to object to the proposed Clay Pits and construction materials recycling facility for Pallinghurst Woods, not enough research has been done on the effect this will have on the wildlife that inhabit the woods, not enough observation has been carried out on the Bats that live there only a very small portion of the woods this has been carried out on, not the overall area, plus some of their roosting trees will be felled. The application does not include the closure of the footpath around the Clay pit which is a great concern to the safety of people and animals it is not good enough, the woods will become a dangerous place, as there won't be enough safety barriers in place near the deep pits or HGV traffic.</p> <p>There is also not enough evidence there is a shortage for clay, plus why should our woods support shortage in other parts of the country.</p> <p>With new housing going up everywhere in the villages, not enough drainage for excess water, plus no speed controls through our country roads or villages, the speed of vehicles and lorries are out of control now, and a real danger to both pedestrians and cars, the A281 can't cope now with the increase of traffic, let alone an increase of work vehicles.</p> <p>The application has not provided enough proof that there is a need for additional construction materials recycling in West Sussex. The proposal should be REFUSED given the detrimental impact on the woodland and species of wildlife, plus the surrounding area.</p> |
