Comments	<p>Thank you for the opportunity to object to this application.</p> <p>Clearly the proposal is very detrimental to the environment in which we and future generations live in. It seems wholly unnecessary given that other facilities already exist to provide this service. It will have a long term devastating effect on the wildlife locally and regional and will also cause a lot of damage to the local transport network (small rural roads).</p> <p>WSCC seem to have excellent policies to protect our way of life and the applicants seem to be critical of these policies, purely in pursuit of profit for their client, who, though landowner, lives nowhere near the site and will not be affected by it.</p> <p>There seems to be no evidence that stands up for the need for the facility. There is not a shortage of what they hope to provide in this region.</p> <p>Public access to the area will be detrimentally affected. It is a well used area and the source of physical and mental health to many of us on a daily basis. We would lose this and so would future generations, which doesn't seem fair at all. Though the woodland will still exist, it will not be attractive for anyone to visit any longer and this effect will be felt in many of the other local woodlands and public areas as the noise and pollution from the facility will travel a long way from it's source.</p> <p>The reality of the volume of HGV traffic passing through the woodland will be very detrimental. The roads will collapse in many places through over use and overload. Many people on their way to work and school each day will be faced with lorries moving through at speed to meet the deadlines they have to offload and collect materials. There will certainly be accidents as the roads are not wide enough to accommodate these vehicles passing each other at numerous points, they will be covered in debris and mud &amp; clay from exiting the woodland and this will sit on the roads all winter or whenever it rains, causing skid and collision risks aplenty.</p>
