Thank you for re-consulting the Environment Agency in regard to the above application.

We have reviewed the additional information that has been submitted and have no further comments to make. Our previous response dated 25 August 2021 (our ref; HA/2021/123406/01) still stands, and this is copied below for ease of reference.

"Environment Agency position

We request that the following condition be attached to any planning permission granted, and that the details in relation to the condition be submitted and approved by the Local Planning Authority.

<u>Condition</u>

If, during development, contamination not previously identified is found to be present at the site then no further development (unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority) shall be carried out until a remediation strategy detailing how this contamination will be dealt with has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the Local Planning Authority.

The remediation strategy shall be implemented as approved.

<u>Reasons</u>

To ensure that the development does not contribute to, and is not put at unacceptable risk from or adversely affected by, unacceptable levels of water pollution from contamination sources at the development site.

This is in line with paragraph 170 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

Advice to Applicant

If sandstone bands contain groundwater and dewatering is required, abstraction licences may potentially be required. We would advise the Applicant to liaise with us at an early stage to confirm any licencing requirement associated with dewatering.

The infilling of the quarry is likely to require a permit, such a deposit for recovery permit. We would advise the Applicant to liaise with us at an early stage with the details of any recovery scheme, to confirm permitting requirement.
